FIRST AID: This is certainly not an exclusive need of the diver, but for a comprehensive listing of equipment it stands high in priority. Skin is softer and easier to cut after long immersion in water. Moving about among underwater obstacles can result in scrapes and cuts that should be attended to as soon as possible. Sunburn is a potential problem. There are more serious injuries and accidents that can happen, ant it is always best to be ready.

A basic first aid kit should include the following items;

Sodium chloride tablets (salt)
Antiseptic - Mercurochrome or Merthiclate
Alcohol to rinse ears (not for bends prevention)
Aromatic spirits of ammonia (smelling salts)
Seasickness tablets
Burn cintment
Suntan lotion
Assorted sterile bandages in individual packs
Adhesive tape
Gauze
Castor cil or mineral cil for use in eyes
Tweezers
Scissors
First Aid Booklet.

Prepared First Aid Kits are readily obtainable from Chemists.

NEW BCOK BY DR. JCHN MERO: Dr. John Mero's new book, "The Mineral Resources of the Sea", published by Elseview Publishing Company, represents in our opinion the most significant achievement in the field of underwater mining in many years. The book is characterised by vast quantities of data which have been carefully organized, tabulated and indexed in such a way as to present a coherent picture of the ocean's mineral resources.

The book is an encyclopedic reference, with information on nearly every aspect of ocean mining including diamonds, gold, salt, oil, phosphate, manganese, etc. It considers geology, recovery techniques and equipment, economics, and even international law as applied to the topic of Mineral Resources of the Sea.
